



## Guidelines for Completing Woman of Achievement Nomination Form

The purpose of the Woman of Achievement Award is to recognize a woman who has demonstrated a commitment to and provided leadership in the community. As a result of her service, the community is a "better" place to live.

- 1) It is not necessary for a nominee to have had a business or professional career. The individual is being recognized because of her contributions to the community. She may also be a member of the Zonta Club of Fredericksburg.
- 2) The following are examples of possible achievements, and a nominee may fit into more than one category. These categories are only examples and the list should not be considered all inclusive.
  - a) "Visionary" A woman who has a concept/design of a program that benefits the community as a whole. For example some possible programs already in Fredericksburg would be the Recycling Center, Boys/Girls Club, and the Good Samaritan Center.
  - b) "Leader" A woman who has been a major voice in the implementation and/or promotion of a community service and/or program and/or project which has helped to solve an issue or community need; or, she has provided the leadership to implement someone else's idea.
  - c) "Worker Bee" A woman who volunteers for more than one activity, but doesn't take the lead. She devotes hours to getting the "job" accomplished. You can count on her. She is reliable.
  - d) "Philanthropist" A woman who is generous with her financial resources and provides these resources to benefit the community.

Please remember the above is not all-inclusive, but is written to provide you with some ideas for selecting a woman for this award. Hopefully you can expand on the Woman of Achievement Committee's thoughts.
