AMELIA EARHART ESSAYS

Zonta Club of Fredericksburg announces its Amelia Earhart Essay Contest for girls between the ages of 12 and 18 years who live in Gillespie County. The club celebrates Ame-

lia Earhart Day on Jan. 8. In 1928, Amelia Earhart

was inducted into Zonta International where she served as an active member first in the Boston club and later in the New York club until her disappearance in 1937. There are two categories

There are two categories for the contest. Girls ages 12-14 years will need to write a minimum of 500 words and use at least five reference sources. Prizes for this age group will be \$150 for first and area for second

\$100 for second.

Girls ages 15-18 years are required to write a minimum of 1,000 words and use at least seven reference sources.

Prizes for this age group

will be \$300 for first and \$200 for second. The deadline for submit-

ting essays is Jan. 1, 2018. All of the contestants are

allowed to write about any aspect of Earhart's life, in-cluding the recent searches for her plane.

The essays will be judged on content, organization,

grammar and spelling. Essays must be typed or computer generated. A cover sheet containing name, address, phone number and email address must be included.


The winners and their parents will be guests at the Jan. 15, 2018, Zonta meeting to read their essays and receive their prizes.




