The Admiral Nimitz Museum is located at 340 East Main, Fredericksburg. There is parking in the front of the Museum on Main Street. Additional parking is also available on the East side of the Museum along North Washington AND on the north side of the Museum along East Austin Street.

PLEASE NOTE: The front entrance door to the Admiral Nimitz Museum will be locked due to the restoration/renovation project of the Museum. ENTRANCE TO THE ADMIRAL NIMITZ BALL ROOM WILL ONLY BE FROM THE PATIO AREA THROUGH THE FISHER WEISER PREP KITCHEN AREA DOOR, which opens on the west side of the ballroom. You can reach this patio area from Main Street as the walk way (behind the Admiral Nimitz statue on Main Street) leads into the patio area, OR by entering on the back side of the Museum (from the Austin street side) coming up to the patio by the gazebo.



Zonta International President Susanne von Bassewitz and other thought leaders discuss effective solutions for ending child marriage during Zonta's side event with the Mission of the Republic of Niger. Zonta brings stakeholders together for discussion around effective actions to end child marriage.

“Child marriage is effectively a mass abuse of human rights. Our position is not only based on moral grounds; it is also based on legal and political grounds,” said Ambassador Mara Marinaki, the European External Action Service’s Principal Advisor on Gender and the implementation of UNSCR 1325 on Women, Peace and Security, at a side event on child, early and forced marriage during the 63rd Session of the Commission on the Status of Women last month in New York. Margaret Greene, President of GreeneWorks, moderated the side event, convened by Zonta International and the Mission of the Republic of Niger. It brought together governments, UN agencies and NGOs to discuss the necessary social systems, public services and infrastructure required to empower adolescent girls to say no to child, early and forced marriage, complete their education and realize their full potential.


Hotel accommodation and conference registration information for the conference will be sent to us by mid August, but transportation plans with Austin Aloha Limousine will need to be settled earlier.

The ESTIMATES on the conference expenses are: \$235 for conference registration (that's for the 2 day conference; includes lunch both days and banquet dinner on Saturday); and Hotel accommodations have priced each room with double Queen beds at \$109 (plus applicable tax) each night. We will be staying 3 nights, and if you want to share a room, never too late to find someone to help share that cost.

The estimated transportation cost per occupant, round trip, is \$275 per person. Reserved seats will be offered on a first come, first served basis. Money must be paid by August 1, 2019, NO EXCEPTIONS PLEASE. **Make checks payable to Frankie Hohenberger** as she will be the responsible party for securing this mode of transportation.


