
# ZONTASNO TO VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN

# ZCF Announces our Amelia Earhart Writing Contest

for girls between the ages of 12 and 18 that live in Gillespie County. The Club celebrates Amelia Earhart Day every January 8th. In 1928, Amelia Earhart was inducted into Zonta International. where she served as an active member first in the Boston Club and later in the New York Club until her untimely disappearance in 1937. The contest will have two categories; girls ages 12-14 will need to submit a paper with a minimum of 500 words with references listed as required Prizes for this age group will be \$150.00 for 1st prize and \$100.00 for 2nd prize. Girls ages 15-18 will need to submit a paper with a minimum of 1000 words with reference listings as required. Prizes for this age group will be \$300.00 for 1st prize and \$200.00 for 2nd prize. The deadline for submitting papers is January 4, 2020; no papers received afterwards will be considered a part of the contest.

All of the contestants are allowed to write about any aspect of Amelia Earhart's life including the recent searches for her plane, how her life and accomplishments influenced women's roles in our society, her rise to fame and her successes as an aviator, celebrity and/or business person. The papers will be judged on content, grammar, organization, spelling and overall readability. They must be typed or computer generated. Papers must include a cover sheet with the entrant's name and age on January 1, 2020, parent's name(s), address, phone number and email address. The winners and their parents will be guests at the January 20, 2020 Zonta meeting to read their papers and receive their prizes.







# The Official Christmas Gift Exchange Game Rules

- 1. Each player brings one wrapped gift to place in a pool of gifts under the "tree."
- 2. Each player draws a number to figure in what order they will go.
- 3. Players sit so they can see the gift pile.
- 4. The first player selects a gift from under the "tree" and opens it. Make sure everyone get to see the gift!
- 5. Following sequentially, players in turn can choose to either pick an unwrapped gift or steal a previous player's gift.

  Anyone who gets their gift stolen in this way immediately may choose a new gift or steal from someone else as a replacement.
- 6. A present can only be stolen once per turn, which means players who have a gift stolen from them have to wait a turn to get it back.
- 7. After two swaps of the same gift (the 3<sup>rd</sup> holder) the turn automatically comes to an end and the gift is FROZEN. Let it Go!
- 8. If, and only if, after all players have had a turn and the first player is still holding her original gift, she gets a chance to swap the gift for any other opened gift that has not been FROZEN. Play Ends.


If you are in need of more tickets, please let me know NOW. Thanks in advance for your selling magic that I know everyone is doing. This is most critical to our overall fund raising success.
